Clark County Fire District 6 is currently seeking a qualified mechanic to fill a vacancy within our Maintenance Division.

### Compensation

Salary Range: \$32 - \$38 per hour

Benefits: Medical, dental, vision, life, and disability insurance. Paid vacation, sick leave, holiday, and compensatory time. Washington PERS retirement program. District Wellness Program.

This position is not a part of the bargaining unit.

### Clark County Fire District 6

Fire District 6 is in the southwest corner of Washington State. Our response area covers 37 square miles and serves a population of approximately 75,000. The district borders the City of Vancouver on the south and east sides and is in unincorporated Clark County.

The District was formed in 1954 to provide fire protection to the Hazel Dell, Lakeshore, Felida and Salmon Creek areas. Initially served by volunteer firefighters, the District has grown into an all-hazards EMS, fire and rescue organization. It currently employs 63 full-time responders, 3 training officers, four chief officers, an office administrator, an office assistant, a public education and information officer, a facilities maintenance person, a part-time maintenance person, and a mechanic (currently vacant). We also have a Support Services Volunteer Program with 19 members.

### Nature and Purpose of Work

The primary purpose of this position is to meet our mission and to be a good steward of the resources provided to us by our community. The maintenance division is tasked with preventing costly breakdowns and ensuring operational readiness of the fleet and associated equipment. Under supervision, the mechanic provides on-going service, maintenance and repair of District apparatus, tools, and equipment.

The Full-time Mechanic will work 40 hours per week on a 5-day/8-hour work schedule.

Although not an exhaustive list, the following are some examples of the mechanic's responsibilities:

- Perform routine service, preventative maintenance, and repair for all District apparatus, fleet vehicles and equipment.
- Maintain an inventory of tools and parts.
- Documentation using District computer systems.
- Move vehicles of all types throughout the region.
- Maintain the shop.
- Assist the Maintenance Division with other duties to balance the workload.
- Provide input in the budgeting and apparatus replacement processes.
- Maintain certifications and proficiency through education and training.

### **Qualifications**

Any combination of education, experience and training will be considered to evaluate the candidate's qualifications.

### **Minimum Qualifications**

A qualified applicant will have good written and computer skills as well as a positive and friendly demeanor. They will also possess at least:

- 5 years as a diesel mechanic showing progressive achievement of ASE/EVT certifications.
- Possess or have the ability to obtain (with the District's support) a Washington State Class A CDL within 3 months of hiring.
- ASE Certifications:
  - T1 Truck, Gasoline Engines
  - T2 Truck, Diesel Engines
  - T3 Truck, Drive Train
  - T4 Truck, Brakes
  - T5, Truck Suspension and Steering
  - T6, Truck, Electrical Systems
  - T7 Heating/Vent/Air Conditioning
  - T8 PMI (Preventative Maintenance Inspection)

### **Desired Qualifications**

In addition to the minimum qualifications, the District prefers candidates with:

- 10+ years as an ASE Certified Diesel Mechanic
- Any of the following EVT Certifications:
  - Fire Apparatus Technician 1
  - Fire Apparatus Technician 2

- Fire Apparatus Master Technician
- Progress between certifications will be considered

### **Ideal Qualifications**

An ideal candidate will have 10 or more years as a diesel mechanic with a verifiable record of progressively achieving advanced certifications. Of those 10 years, at least 5 years will have been as an EVT in a fire service organization. They will possess a valid Washington State Class A CDL as well as the EVT Fire Apparatus Master Technician Certification. Membership, participation and leadership in trade and professional organizations is valued.
